Year End Violations Program Review

The review is conducted using only written Violation Notices issued by RIC Public Safety staff for the calendar year starting 01/01/2024 and ending 12/31/2024.

Verbal warnings or coaching that are elements of the program are not documented or tracked.

Violations are sorted in to four categories:

- GROUND OPERATIONS (security related infractions)
- VEHICLE OPERATIONS (driving related infractions)
- FUELING OPERATIONS (bulk fuel storage, transport, and delivery)
- OTHER (all other infractions)

Violations are also sorted by employer type in an effort to focus on future education and compliance efforts. Violations are tracked by each charged infraction.






Richmond International Airport sets record for most guns caught at its checkpoints in 2024

According to a spokesperson for the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), officers intercepted 145 handguns at Virginia airport security checkpoints in 2024, which was the most guns ever detected in a single year.

Officials said four airports in Virginia set records for the most guns caught at their checkpoints in a year, with 32 guns caught at the Richmond International Airport in 2024.











