# The USO Celebrates Their 83rd National Anniversary



FOR THE PEOPLE WHO SERVE."

The United Service Organizations (USO) was founded on February 4, 1941, by a congressional charter. Their mission, "to strengthen the well-being of the people serving in America's military and their families," string rings true after 83 years. The USO has a prominent location inside Richmond International Airport (RIC), which opened on July 10, 2010.

The RIC USO location was installed with the expectation of serving 1,000 service members and families per month; the location quickly surpassed that number and was seeing over

3,000 individuals per month prior to 2020. In 2023, the RIC USO served an impressive 32,354 troops and families. While visiting the center, military visitors can relax, charge their phones, have a snack, and play games from 8 a.m.-8 p.m. 365 days a year. The USO has an amazing team that supports families through planeside funeral honors if they have lost a service member. The Richmond USO Dignified Transfer team stands ready day or night to escort families during difficult times.

In addition to the center, the USO offers support to local bases including Fort Gregg-Adams, Fort Barfoot, Cheatam Annex, and beyond. The USO is a non-profit 501(c)(3) that is not government funded and relies on volunteers and community support to stay operational.
